Hello,

We have a wonderful problem in our Sunday meetings, and we need to hear from you as we try to solve it.

Over the past few months, our 9:30am meeting has grown. Our kids' work is now at capacity, meaning children are regularly having to stay in the adult meeting. And our youth work has grown to a point where we can no longer safely squeeze in many more young people. In the main auditorium, it's becoming increasingly tight, too.

Not only is this an issue for our church family, it's a missional problem too, because it means we no longer have room for any visitors coming in. Meanwhile, in our 11:30am meeting, there's plenty of space. God has told us in the past that he has many people in this town – and that we mustn't turn off the taps. And so, together, we need to rethink our Sunday meetings.

One immediate solution we're looking at is to take our young people off-site to create more space for our kids and young people – but this would still only address part of the problem. We also need to create greater balance across our two Sunday meetings.

And so, in the coming months, we're considering changing the times of our meetings to **9am-10:30am** and **11am-12:30pm**. This short survey is to help us get an idea of the impact this would have.

We'd be grateful if **one person from each household** could answer the following questions, as best you can, by the end of Sunday 16 April at the latest please. We know that situations change – and if you have children, we understand that decisions you make about which meeting to attend might be affected by the decisions of other families – but we're hoping it will give us a snapshot of the impact a change in meeting times would have.

We'll provide feedback to the church at the end of April/early May. And if we are to change our meeting times, it won't be before the middle of June.
