PRAYER WALK GUIDE

There is no fixed way to do a prayer walk: you can be as creative as you like. Whatever you do, **keep it simple, keep it real, keep it up**. If you'd like some ideas please take a look at the suggestions below:

1. Look Within

As you begin your walk, talk to God about the things that you can be grateful for: your shoes that protect your feet (keep it real!), your health, your family/friends, His eternal love for you, His glory, love, kindness and patience towards you, His passion and desires to see many saved. Thank Him for these things.

Thank Him for the weather: if it's raining, praise Him for his provision of water, if it's sunny, thank Him for the sunshine.

2. Look Out

What is God drawing your attention to on your walk: what do you see around you? Is God highlighting a place, a building, a street, a school, a church building, a mosque, a business?

Pray for whatever God is showing you, and ask Him to bless the things He is pointing out, and the people connected with them.

Pray that the buildings, facilities and locality are used for His glory.

Pray for people you may know in that area, particularly anyone on your BLESS list.

3. Look Ahead

Pray that whole families and communities would hear the good news and find out who Jesus really is. Pray that we as a church would find good ways of connecting with them.

Pray that God would give each of us vision and creative ideas for reaching the people of our town.

Pray for our leaders as they head up and release new initiatives.

Thank God for the new ministries we have started especially King's Table and Azalea. Pray for many opportunities for those who serve in them to bless people and share the gospel.

Many people in our town have yet to be reached with the good news of Jesus. Pray that they would hear the gospel and respond to Jesus.

Pray that the Kingdom of God would reign in High Wycombe.

Pray that Jesus would be lifted high here and that His glory, healing, power, transformation and grace would be revealed to all who live here.
